## NEW FLIGHT OPTIONS FOR THE HOLIDAY SEASON

Starting this holiday season, travellers will have the option to fly non-stop to Little Rock, Arkansas, Memphis, Tennessee and Shreveport, Louisiana. GLO, a New Orleans owned and based public charter operator, will begin daily non-stop flights to each of these destinations starting November 15th. GLO offers a quality alternative to business and leisure travelers that had been relegated to multi-stop flights and long drive times to reach these destinations. GLO's flights will be operated by Corporate Flight Management, Inc. from Concourse B using a 30-passenger Saab 340B aircraft. Each city will be served twice daily Monday through Friday and once daily to each destination on weekends. Tickets are available at [www.FlyGLO.com](http://www.FlyGLO.com).

Additionally, Spirit Airlines will begin daily service to Las Vegas, Nevada, in November. With the addition of Las Vegas, Spirit will offer non-stop service to six destinations. The other non-stop destinations include – Chicago, Dallas, Detroit, Ft. Lauderdale and Houston. Spirit Airlines offers ultra-low fares and a range of optional services for a fee. This allows passengers to choose the travel options they prefer, such as checking bags, seat assignments, and refreshments. Spirit currently operates more than 375 daily flights to 57 destinations within the U.S., Latin America, and the Caribbean onboard a modern and fuel-efficient all-Airbus fleet. They operate from Concourse C at Armstrong International. Also in time for the busy holiday season, Delta Air Lines is adding additional frequency to Detroit, Michigan. Passengers will be able to choose between three daily non-stop flight
